

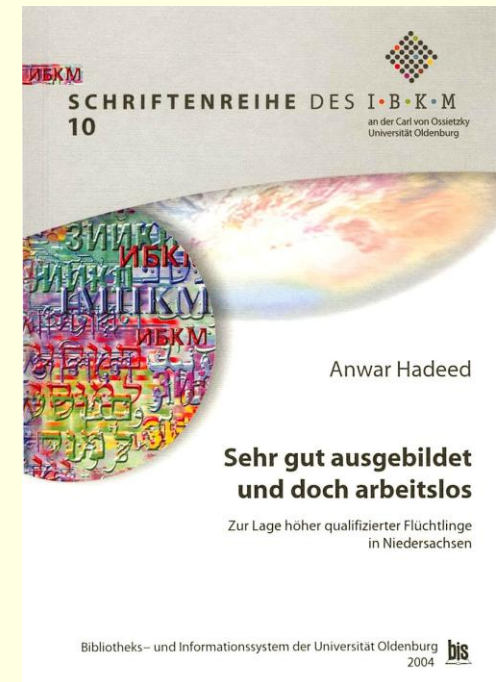

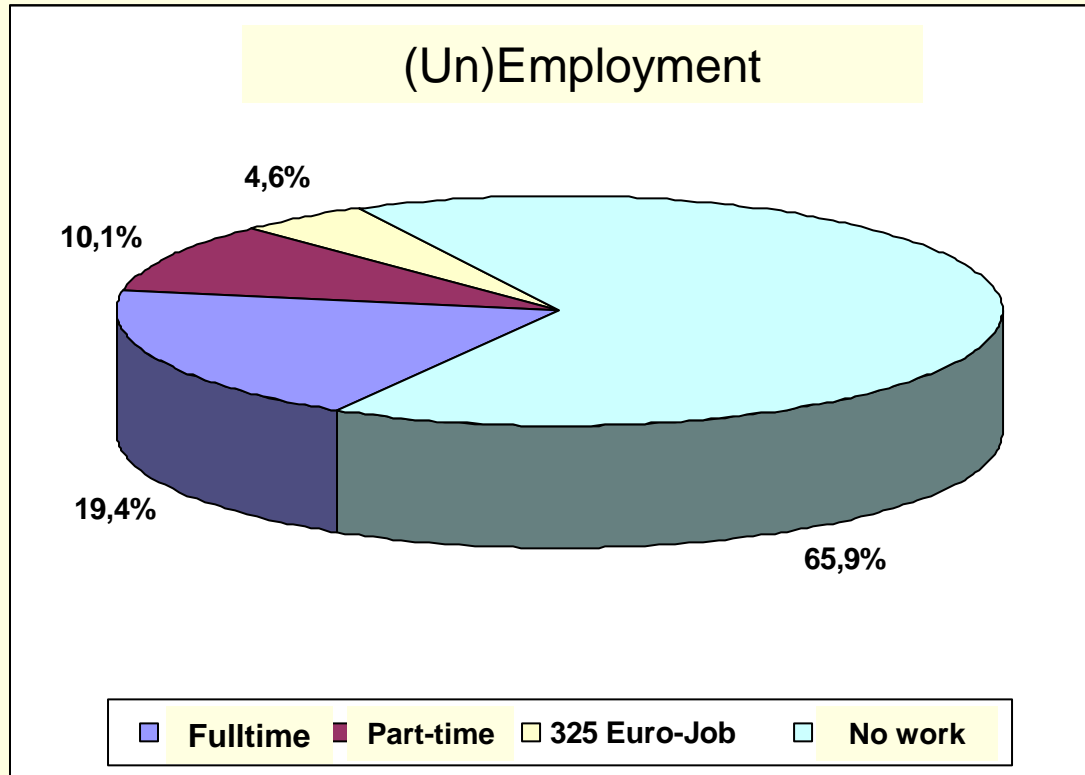

Development of the study programme

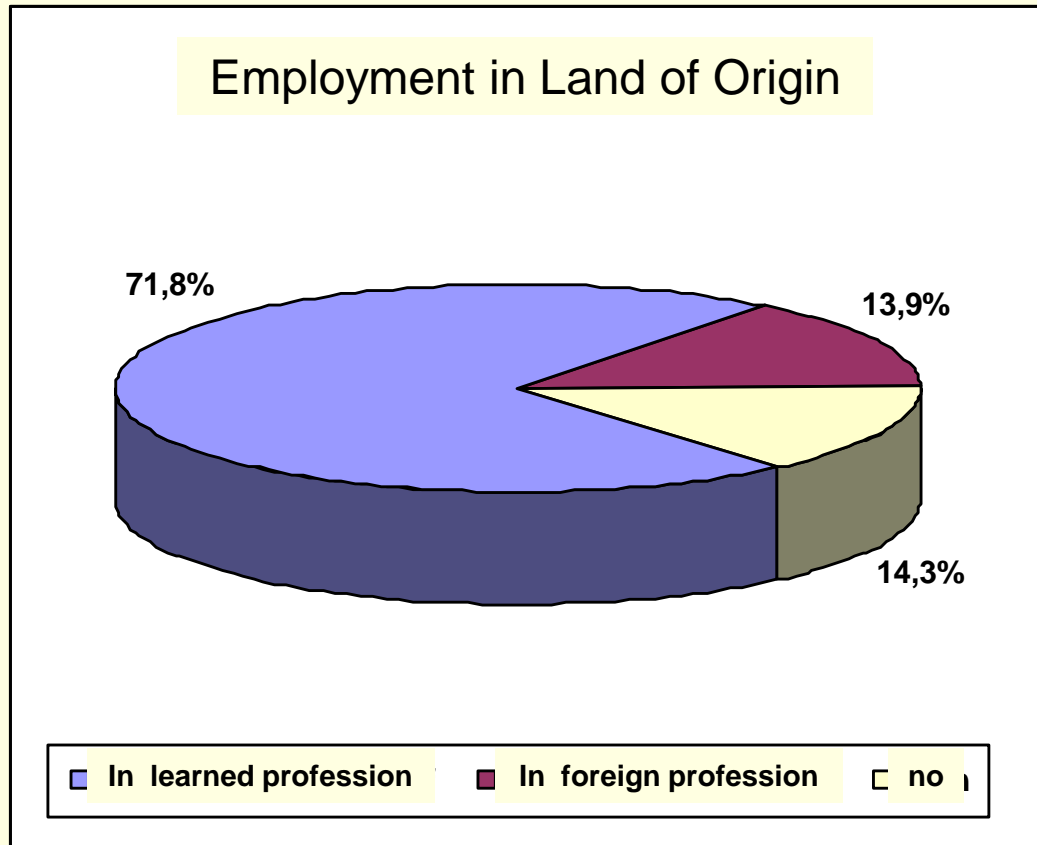
- Study „Well-educated, yet unemployed“

Data on (Un)Employment



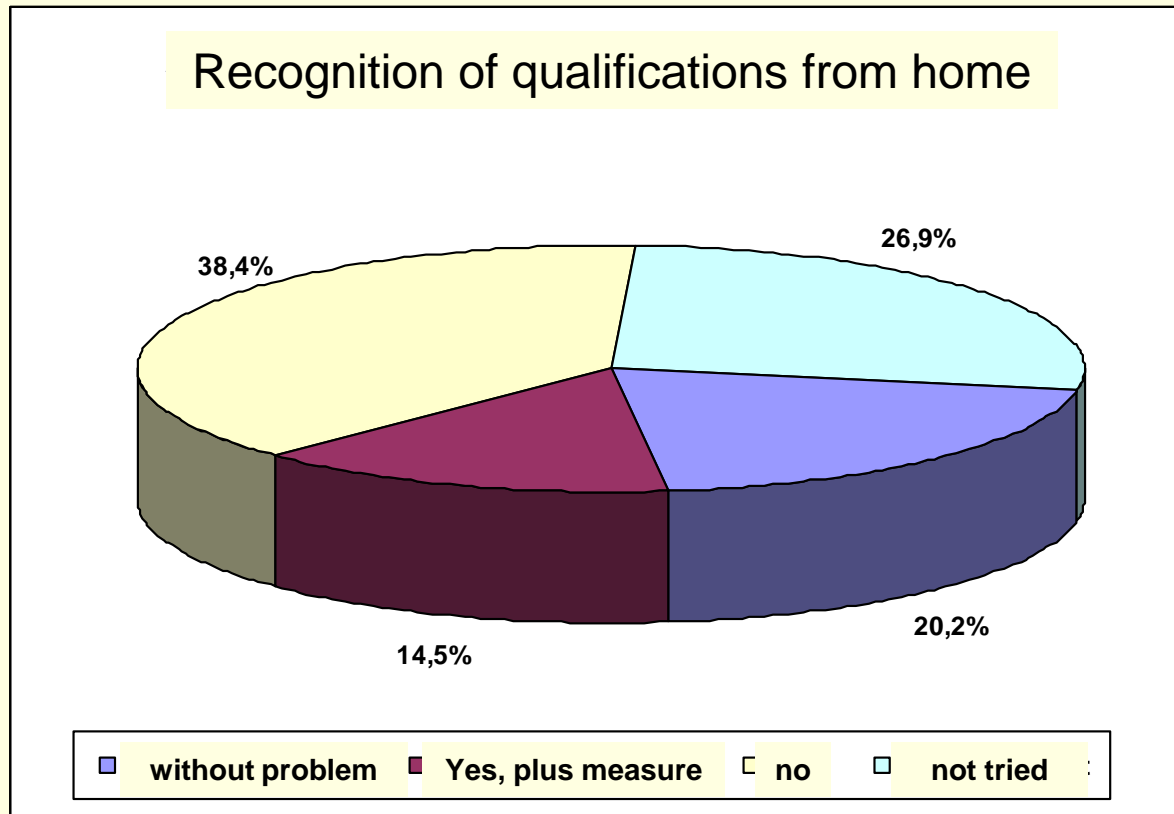
Data on Employment in Land of Origin



Reasons for lack of integration

- Individual qualifications and competences are widely not recognised
- High information deficit concerning integration measures
- German language knowledge not sufficient
- Low recognition rate of formal vocational degrees
- Insufficient counselling for vocational integration
- Lack of appropriate continuing education programmes for highly qualified migrants

Data on recognition of qualifications from home



Target group

- Working migrants
- Resettlers („Spätaussiedler“)
- Family members of resettlers
- Refugees with right of residence
- Jewish immigrants

Prerequisites

- University entrance requirement
- Individual migration background
- At least 2 Semesters of studies
- 2 years of vocational employment or voluntary activity/experience

Study structure

- Begin: WS 2006/07
- Duration: 4 semesters
- Recognition of 2 Semesters (Ressource orientation)
- Attendance required
- Lectures and seminars in form of modules

Study content

- Advanced module (2nd Year of Study)
- Professionalisation module (3rd Year of Study)
- Scientific terminology German
- Internship module
- Bachelor thesis

Degree and vocational fields

- Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)
- Access to Master study programme

Feedback of applicants

- Objective: 20 students
- ca. 200 inquiries from all over Germany
- 46 applications
- 24 matriculations
- Students coming from 4 states (Lower-Saxony, Bremen, North Rhine-Westphalia, Baden-Württemberg)

Participant Composition

- 17 women, 7 men
- 25 - 55 years of age
- most of them not employed
- 13 lands of origin (Eastern Europe, Asia, Africa, Latin America)
- Duration of residence: 3 – <10 years
